

Useful information



VISAs

EU, Switzerland, Norway, Iceland and Liechtenstein citizens can travel to the UK for short trips (up to six months) without needing a visa. You must travel using a passport which is valid for the duration of your stay to enter the UK.

National ID cards are no longer accepted as travel documents (apart from in the case of some limited exceptions outlined by the UK government).

Other visitors should check if they require a visa and apply online via the **official UK government website**. It can take several weeks to process visa applications.

Electronic Travel Authorisation (ETA) scheme

By the end of 2024, the UK government is set to introduce an **Electronic Travel Authorisations (ETA) scheme** for visitors and passengers transiting through the UK, who do not currently need a visa for short stays or have an immigration status prior to travelling.

* Please be aware that the rules change regularly and it is your responsibility to ensure you have the latest information. (This information was last updated in November 2022)

VAT

The UK government sets the rules for applying VAT on events based in the UK, for services such as registration fees and accommodation costs.

Some key things to remember:

- The location of the organiser does not affect these rules.
- Under current rules, EU businesses must register and pay VAT if fee revenue exceeds the current income threshold of £85,000.
- VAT incurred in the UK on event costs, such as venue, professional services and catering, can be offset against the VAT due on income.
- The difference between the tax due and the tax recoverable can be reclaimed through a VAT reclaim procedure (generally a six to 12-month recovery period).

Accessibility and travel

Heathrow

London Heathrow Airport

Welcoming more than 80 million passengers in 2019, London Heathrow Airport (LHR) is the largest aviation hub in the world and the UK's largest airport. One of the world's most advanced airports, Heathrow is easily accessible by Tube, train (via the Heathrow Express with direct link to Paddington station), or by taxi. The newly opened Elizabeth line provides direct access to central London in about 30 minutes. It is operated by Transport for London and part of the Oyster card and contactless ticketing system.



London Stansted Airport

London Stansted Airport (STN) is one of Europe's fastest-growing airports with many budget airlines offering flights to Europe. The quickest way into central London is via the Stansted Express with trains to London Liverpool Street station taking 50 minutes.

LONDON CITY AIRPORT

London City Airport

Located in the east side of the city, London City
Airport (LCY) is the smallest airport in London. Its
single runway handles short-haul flights with a strong
emphasis on business travel to Europe. It is the
closest airport to central London, with easy access via
the DLR network, as well as taxis. It is also the closest
airport to London's largest convention centre, ExCeL
London.



London Gatwick Airport

In 2019, London Gatwick (LGW) sent 46.6 million customers on their way making it the UK's second largest airport. The Gatwick Express is a direct train service linking the airport to the centrally located Victoria station in 30 minutes. Thameslink and Southern rail operators also offer train services from Gatwick to several central London stations within 30 minutes.



London Southend Airport

London Southend Airport (SEN) is one of the UK's fastest-growing regional airports. Trains to the centrally located Liverpool Street station run every 10 to 20 minutes and the journey time is less than an hour.



London Luton Airport

London Luton Airport (LTN) is one of the UK's largest airports, offering a base to several budget airlines including easyJet. Luton Airport Parkway train station is located 10 minutes from the airport by shuttle bus, and trains to central London take between 20 and 40 minutes depending on the train operator.



Eurostar

Flying isn't the only way to get to London. The high-speed rail service Eurostar is the ultimate travel experience, with a choice of frequent departures, speedy check-in and direct routes between European city centres. Eurostar's high-speed trains have revolutionised travel between the UK and continental Europe. London is just a little more than two hours from Paris or Brussels or four hours from Amsterdam.





Experience a different side of London with every visit, as exciting new spaces open all year round. Here is a snapshot of what's new in the city.

Recent openings

Thoughtfully designed **One Hundred Shoreditch** opened its doors to a 258-bedroom hotel with a rooftop space and panoramic views of London. With seafood restaurant Goddard & Gibbs housed downstairs and an underground cocktail bar, the hotel can host up to 80 people for a reception.

Outernet combines the latest technology with culture, music and arts to create a world-class entertainment district on Tottenham Court Road. Offering private hire, HERE at Outernet, features cutting-edge equipment and can host up to 2,000 guests in this striking events space.



Located in one of London's most exciting regeneration districts, art'otel London Battersea **Power Station** features 160 rooms as well as roof garden with outdoor pool overlooking the iconic chimneys of Battersea Power Station.

Set across 16 properties in and around Denmark Street, Chateau Denmark is a unique hotel consisting of 55 suites and apartments with interior design references to the wild days of London's punk and rock music scenes.

Curio Collection by Hilton has opened a new site, Lost Property St Paul's London, a six-floor hotel with 145 bedrooms. With St Paul's Cathedral close by, the interior of the hotel complements the area with classic features and rich tones.

London isn't short of venues either, and The Reveller at the Tower of London is a brand-new outdoor space on the Wharf next to Tower Bridge. The space is accessible for large groups and hosts up to 300 people, and uniquely placed to seamlessly combine the event with other spaces in the area.







Set among the historic landmarks of the City of London, Convene is set to launch its new St Paul's location in 2023. The impressive venue promises plenty of natural light, carefully curated design and one of the largest meeting and events spaces in the area covering 4,000sqm (44,000sq ft).

Just a few steps from Marble Arch, **Frameless** brings a multidimensional, immersive art experience to the West End. There are no white walls, just art – choose the Blank Canvas room for events with bespoke backdrops, or opt for exclusive hire for up to 640 people.

ExCel London has begun a major transformation with a 25,000 sq m (269,098 sq ft) expansion, boasting new conference rooms, exhibition spaces and convention facilities. It'll be targeting a BREEAM rating of "excellent" in a boost to the world-class venue's already strong green credentials.

A £1.3bn redevelopment of **Olympia London** sees the introduction of cutting-edge conference facilities, new food and drink outlets and a sky garden with views of the capital. The events destination will also welcome a host of new neighbours including two stylish hotels, a 4,400-capacity live music venue and a 1,575-seat theatre.



Coming soon

London is continuously evolving and we're looking forward to more hotels and new venues opening their doors in the next year.

Host your event in the King's Cross area at Grade II-listed **Bottaccio Kings Cross**, which is set to be a 1,500-capacity venue with a large performance stage, 13m ceiling height and expansive mezzanine. **Park Hyatt London River Thames** has also chosen the Nine Elms area for its new home, comprising

203 bedrooms and suites. The hotel will have an executive wing and event spaces, including a large ballroom.

Find the best of British culture and 190 exquisitely styled guest rooms and suites at **The Peninsula London**. It is set to feature a grand entrance and courtyard reception, as well as a grand ballroom to host spectacular events.


OCEANDIVA the first CO2 neutral event venue on the river Thames opens in 2023. The vessel has flexibility of either sailing on the river or remaining static at one of several ports and is perfect for gala dinners, receptions, conferences and product launches. It offers a blank canvas across three decks and can accommodate 500 seated or 1500 standing.

New London



An upcoming hotel that will have sustainability at its core is **1 Hotel Mayfair**, with 184 guest rooms and a celebrated farm-to-table restaurant. A former 1970s car park will be transformed into **The Marylebone** Lane Hotel, Westminster in 2023. The 199-bedroom hotel has been designed to achieve a BREEAM (Building Research Establishment Environmental Assessment Method) "excellent" rating and will feature a rooftop swimming pool, as well as multiple event spaces.

Occupying the redeveloped 15 Old Bailey, Hyde **London Paradox Hotel London City** is set to feature 110 bedrooms, two restaurants and a speakeasy bar. **Raffles Hotels & Resorts** is transforming the former

The UN Sustainable Development Goals

At COP27, the United Nations Climate Change conference that took place in Sharm El-Sheikh in November 2022. Net Zero Carbon Events launched its roadmap demonstrating how the industry can take action on travel, accommodation, energy and waste, and that measurement is key in order to track progress.

A Net Zero Roadmap for the Events Industry is the largest and most

inclusive action from the industry to date, providing comprehensive information on how to implement action to achieve net zero.

By COP28, models for implementation and successful pilots will be available to announce and share, and companies will start to report on their progress. Find more information on

Net Zero Carbon Events.

The Glasgow Declaration promoting action in tourism was also well presented at COP27, with sustainable food in tourism a key theme. Topics for consideration included aspects of sustainable food procurement policies, such as sourcing climate friendly and organic food; promoting biodiversity and conserving endangered species such as seafood and fish.

What does net zero mean?

To reach net zero emissions means that the activities within the valuechain of your company result in no net impact on the climate from greenhouse gas emissions. You have to take steps to reduce your emissions to as close to zero emissions as possible.

Any remaining emissions which cannot be removed (residual emissions) should be counterbalanced with an appropriate amount of carbon removals which are permanent. As a rule of thumb, such residual emissions should not exceed 10% of the base vear emissions.

How does the UK plan to become net zero?

The UK has committed to reaching net zero by 2050 under the Climate Change Act. As a signatory to the Paris Agreement, the UK must publish a NDC (nationally determined contribution) which sets out its "highest possible ambition". The UK sets legally binding interim targets through five-year carbon budgets.

The government has developed a Net Zero Strategy. building on the foundations of the Prime Minister's 10-point plan for a green industrial revolution. The strategy sets out policies and proposals for decarbonising all sectors of the UK economy by 2050. Climate risk reporting will become mandatory across the economy by 2025.

How will London become net zero?

The Mayor of London has set out an ambitious mission for the capital to become a net zero carbon, zeropollution city by 2030 and a zerowaste city by 2050.


The Mayor has selected

Accelerated Green as the preferred pathway to reach the 2030 target, which aims to reduce emissions by 78% by 2030, with the remainder to be offset or further reduced shortly after.

This pathway will also help guide the work of the Green New Deal, which aims to tackle the climate and ecological emergencies and improve air quality by doubling the size of London's green economy by 2030.



How is London becoming more sustainable?



Access to a green business ecosystem

London is a climate tech powerhouse, home to 416 climate tech companies, the highest number in Europe. Startups in Europe have raised £3.3bn from London-based VCs over the last two years.

Commitment to a green building standard

The London Plan 2021 requires that all new buildings are constructed to zerocarbon standards and that larger schemes are developed in line with "circular economy" principles. Existing buildings must also be converted to net zero by 2050.

The Greater London Authority (GLA) has pioneered a Whole Life-Cycle Carbon approach to new development and requires all strategic developments to calculate and reduce embodied carbon.

London has a well-established target for new homes to be zero carbon which has been in place since 2016.

Homes and workplaces account for 78% of carbon emissions in London.



Green transport strategy

The Mayor's Transport Strategy aims for 80% of all trips to be made by walking, cycling or public transport by 2041.

Since September 2021, all new TfL buses are zeroemission, with a commitment to deliver a 100% zeroemission fleet by 2034.

London now has more than 8,000 electric vehicle charging points.

London Heathrow Airport is the first major UK airport to successfully integrate sustainable aviation fuel into its distribution.


Green spaces and clean air

London is the world's first National Park City. More than 45% of London is already open green space, and new targets seek to increase this to 50%.

London's Healthy Streets strategy prioritises walking, cycling and using public transport to reduce congestion, improve air quality and create a healthy, people-centred city.

London is committed to making the city's air cleaner. In October 2021, the Ultra Low Emission Zone (ULEZ) expanded to the North and South Circular roads, an area nearly 20 times the size of the previous zone. Central London has seen a drop in nitrogen dioxide concentrations by 44% since the first phase of the ULEZ in 2019.





Food options and less waste

London has a well-established and fast-evolving waste infrastructure focused on converting the city to a circular economy with zero waste by 2050. Numerous recycling schemes are already in place for coffee cups and food waste, plus the capital has an extensive water bottle refilling network.

Additionally, the Sustainable Restaurant Association, consisting of 160 restaurants in the capital, supports the **Food Made Good** programme, which works towards making restaurants and the wider food service sector more sustainable.

Supporting eco-tourist attractions

London is committed to designing vibrant, peoplefriendly spaces which promote wellbeing, stimulate creativity and support green businesses. Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park is a vast public green area, adding 560 acres (227 hectares) of park space to the city.

In a study of 27 of the world's most popular tourist attractions and their sustainability credentials, five London attractions made the ranking: National Gallery, Tower of London, British Museum, London Eye and the Natural History Museum (which took the top spot).





What London venues are doing

More than 120 London businesses are members of the Green Tourism Scheme which promotes sustainability initiatives in the hospitality industry. **The Doyle Collection** hotel group and the **BMA House** and **Church House Westminster** events centres have gold awards.

ISO 20121 sustainable event management accreditation is the standard for managing the social, economic and environmental impacts of events, and some London venues such as **ExCeL London** and **Olympia London** have both been certified in this scheme.

New hotel openings such as **The Londoner**. **Pan Pacific** and **The Westin London City** have put sustainability at the heart of their buildings and have been awarded BREEAM (Building Research Establishment's Environmental Assessment Method) accreditation, which rates the sustainability of buildings, including design, construction and operations.

The Langham is the first hotel in the UK and Europe to receive the Platinum EarthCheck Certification. This award recognises a zero waste to landfill operation, and the food waste recycling system called "Orca" which turns food waste into safe water every 24 hours.

etc.venues has an IACC Green Star accreditation which rewards sustainable design, construction and operation of the building.

OCEANDIVA, and the **Smart Group** has sustainability at its core and will be able to measure the carbon impact of any event from initial sourcing, to energy and food and beverage choices.

Top tips for clients when planning a sustainable event



PLANNING YOUR EVENT

- Ask our team and partners to help design your event to be more sustainable.
- Choose responsible partners for venues, accommodation, transport and catering such as London venues with sustainability accreditations.
- Consider a hybrid or virtual element for your event.
 London has a wealth of smart stage technology and broadcast facilities.

TRAVELLING TO THE EVENT

- Encourage the use of low-carbon transport and use public transport when possible. London's transport network includes 500 electric buses, 20 hydrogen-fuelled double-deckers and 4,000 electric taxis.
- Use the <u>Transport for London</u> website or the <u>TfL</u>
 <u>Go app</u> to find <u>walking and cycling routes.</u>
- Arrive in London by Eurostar trains from Europe, a lower carbon alternative to flying.
- Use UK airlines and airports that are at the forefront of sustainable aviation.



FOOD AT THE EVENT

- Support locally sourced, low-impact food and use minimal meat and dairy. The <u>Food Made Good</u> <u>business directory</u> lists sustainable restaurants and food providers.
- Work with the venue or hotel caterer to achieve a healthy vegetarian or more plant-based menu.
- Use catering companies that have signed up to the UK's <u>Food Waste Reduction Roadmap</u>, which is committed to achieving the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals to halve food waste by 2030.
- Sign up to WRAP's <u>Guardians of Grub</u> foodsaving campaign which provides free resources including calculators, courses and case studies.
- Work with redistribution partners such as City Harvest, The Felix Project and Olio, which deliver food to London's homeless and needy.
- Select a venue that offers onsite filtered water or water bottle refill stations.







- Use eco-friendly materials and avoid high-waste items like single-use plastic bottles and food waste. <u>Ecobooth</u> transforms plastic waste into engaging events and experiences, such as repurposing plastic bottles for exhibition stands and hospitality spaces.
- Avoid unnecessary plastics, packaging and giveaways.
- Consider digital signage and projections instead of print.
- Assess the impact of paper-based versus digital information. Event microsites, mobile apps and interactive technology could be greener options if hosted through suppliers using green energy.

AFTER THE EVENT

- Calculate the total carbon footprint of the event.
 Reset Connect is one of several step-by-step guides on how to collect the right data. Use carbon calculations and assess your impact.
- Set goals to reduce carbon and food waste at future events. <u>WRAP</u> offers practical tips and resources to help.
- Gather attendee feedback and make continuous improvements.
- Donate event waste to <u>Event Cycle</u>, which encourages a circular economy by taking waste from events, conferences, and meetings and repurposing and redistributing it to charities and communities. For example, carpet from the exhibition floor could be donated to social housing projects.

Shoreditch


In recent years, Shoreditch in east London has become a popular and fashionable part of the capital associated with the creative industries. Nowadays the galleries, restaurants, bars and clubs in this part of Hackney are vibrant enough to rival those of the West End. And if that's not exciting enough, the Elizabeth line runs right through its heart with a stop at Whitechapel, connecting the east with the rest of London.

There are several newly opened contemporary hotels to choose from in the area such as **Canopy by Hilton London City** and **YOTEL London Shoreditch**.

The **Dorsett City London** and **Hyatt Place London City East** hotels both have rooftop terraces with superb views across the City, as does **One Hundred Shoreditch**.

If you're looking for something a little more on the casual side, then both **Buckle Street Studios by**

Locke and **Leman Locke** offer apartments complete with a kitchen and living space, as well as communal workspaces beside the cafe!

London has evolved to become the global city it is today, facing challenges to ensure it is equipped for the future. The next generation of smart infrastructure is emerging as the city invests in data connectivity. A new fibre-optic backbone is being installed by Transport for London (TfL) throughout the capital's historic Underground system. And several regeneration projects have launched to revitalise some of London's neighbourhoods.

King's Cross has a unique and rich history and has become a desirable cultural destination with scores of restaurants, bars and shops, thanks to significant investment. The redevelopment of St Pancras International station, which links London to the continent via Eurostar services, has also improved the area's accessibility since 2007.






